Bob: Next month my parents are coming to Nagasaki to see me. I want to show them around Nagasaki, but I've just been here for a month. I want you to tell me where to take them.
Shota: Let's see.... I have an idea! First you should take them to Mt. Inasa. You can see a wonderful view from the top of the mountain both at daytime and at night.
Bob: Sounds great. How can we get there?
Shota: Take Bus No. 3 or 4 at Nagasaki Station and get off at "Ropeway mae". You can see a ropeway station there. Take the ropeway to the top of Mt. Inasa. But are you and your parents OK with high places?
Bob: No problem.
Shota: The station has just been renewed, so the place is really clean and beautiful. I'm sure your parents will like it.
Bob: Thanks. Are there any other good places to visit?
Shota: Well, oh, Battleship Island is worth visiting. It was *registered as World Heritage last year. It looks like a battleship, so it's called so. In Japanese, we call it "Gunkanjima". There were a lot of people working to get *coal from the small island before oil *replaced coal. Now there are no people working there. But there are still old buildings that can tell us about the history of Japanese *industry.
Bob: That's interesting. My father works as an *architect, so he'll be interested in it.
How do we get there?
Shota: Get on a boat at Ohato.
Bob: We can see the view of Nagasaki Port. That's wonderful.
Shota: Oh, Bob. Don't forget to visit the Peace Park and the Atomic Bomb Museum. Nagasaki is a peace-*advocating city. You can learn how horrible the war was and how important peace is. If you go there, streetcars are very convenient.
Bob: I see. I'll think about it. Shota, do you know any good restaurants?
Shota: Nagasaki is famous for champon.
Bob: Pardon? "Champion"?
Shota: Yeah, it sounds like that, but it's "champon".
Bob: What's that?

Shota: Champon means “mixed”. There are many *ingredients, like noodles, vegetables, meat, and seafood in it. It looks like soup pasta. The soup is wonderful. If you eat it *once, you can’t stop. You can eat delicious champon in Chinatown, Chukagai. You can go there by streetcar or bus.

Thousands of people receive new hearts, lungs, livers and *kidneys from *organ donors every year. These organs give sick people the chance of (ア). But do *transplants also change their personality? That sounds crazy, but some scientists think that it is true. An American professor is studying more than 70 stories about people who got a new organ -- and a new personality.

Kind-hearted Lynda Gammons from Britain gave one of her kidneys to her husband, Ian. Before the operation, Ian was a little selfish and hated (イ). Now he's more hard-working and he enjoys cleaning and shopping. He also loves making cakes.

Claire Sylvia from the US was a good-natured, healthy-eating dancer before she received a heart and lung transplant. After the operation, the first thing she wanted to eat was fried chicken. She was also more *bad-tempered than before. Her donor was an *impatient young man who loved fast food. He was driving too fast and had a car accident. When he died, he had some of his (ウ) fried chicken in the car.

A middle-aged American factory worker suddenly loved classical music after he had a heart transplant. (X) The music helped him to feel more relaxed. Who was the donor? A 17-year-old (エ) .

Of course, there are many scientists who do not believe this story. They think there are better reasons that your personality might change after an organ transplant. For example, it may happen because of the medicine that you have to take, or just because you were very sick. (Y) But the American professor says it is best to be open-minded on the subject. Many stories are too strange and have no other explanation.
